NAGASA: 32.9cm SORI: 0.6cm MOTO-KASANE: 7mm MOTO-HABA: 3.2cm SAKI-HABA: 2.2cm

Son-in-law of MURAMASA. The SENGO School falls from SEKI KANEHARU DEN and, along with HEIANJO and SHIMADA, is one of the most powerful BUN-GI era style infuences to the SENGOKU. Strongly standing O-ITAME HADA finds MASAME mixed. SENGO style NOTARE and O-NOTARE swing on an uneven path where swept MURA-NIE collects through the valleys. NIOI is FUKASHI and HOTSURE pulls sparsely from the line. The JIZO-like KO-MARU BOSHI is HAKIKAKE brushed and the KAERI dives smoothly. TANAGO NAKAGO marks this schools' SOSHU/MINO style characteristic. UBU with one ANA. Full polish, SHIRA-SAYA and TOKUBETSU KICHO.

SADAMUNE WAKIZASHI

NAGASA: 38.5cm MOTO-HABA: 3.0cm SORI: 0.7cm MOTO-KASANE: 7mm OMI TAKAGI SADAMUNE is considered the 2nd SOSHU SADAMUNE. He and KANRO TOSHINAGA studied under SOSHU SADAMUNE to form the backbone and roots of the TAKAGI School. This HIRA-TSUKURI has a well-done SOnoKURIKARA and KEN carved in the OMOTE with RENDAL to URA. KO-ITAME HADA has brilliant JI-NIE, NIE-KUZURE GUNOME HA throws SUNAGASHI up like tufted marsh grass as it follows the undulating HABUCHI, signing the unmistakable trait of his fathers' style. SUNAGASHI and deep NIOI pull a small KO-MARU into a TOGARI BOSHI that is low. KAERI falls deeply. The MACHIs seem raised on this many mounted NAKAGO. \$5200
